Introduction

Is the explosion of information a crisis?

Yes, but three quarters of that crisis is caused by not having ways to get information to where it is needed.

Jonathan Schwartz, CEO of Sun Microsystems said in a speech that it was faster to send a petabyte of data from San Francisco to Hong Kong by sailboat than through the Internet. We can assemble the petabyte of data easily, but we can't deliver it where it is needed easily. And that's the true information crisis.

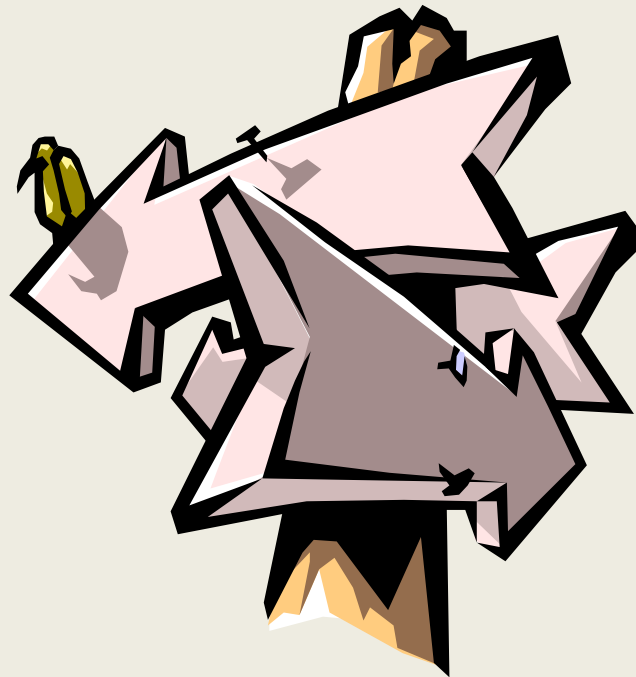
Aims

Our ambition is to come as close to « brainstorming » as possible.

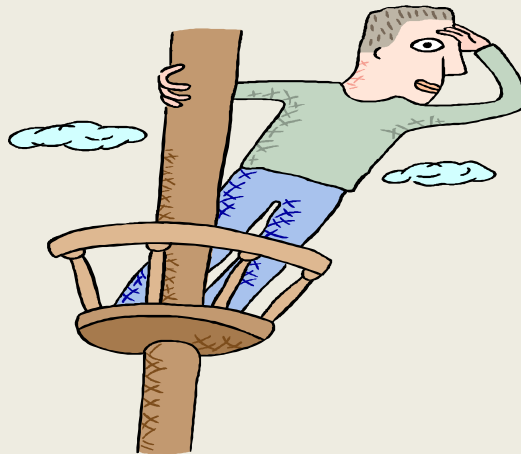
